**Governor Diary -** The Governing body welcomed three new governors in February – Gareth Hughes was

appointed by the Local Authority and Lynne Adams and Kathryn Goddard were co-opted



onto the Governing Body. Gareth is a district councillor and also works for our local MP. Lynne is a teacher at Dene Magna School and a former pupil of St White's. Kathryn is well known to the school as she has run a photography club, helped to produce the Year 6 leavers' books and the school prospectus and is parent of a former pupil. They have attended their first meetings and been into school for induction.

This half term started with a governance review meeting. Governors met for a morning to go through the action items from the previous review and to discuss priorities for the next year. One of the things planned is to create a governor blog on the website, and a Governor Diary report once per half term in the newsletter. Governors will also hold workshops with an external advisor which will be about disadvantaged pupils, wellbeing (to include behaviour and safeguarding), data/outcomes and strategic planning & monitoring.

Our first committee meeting of the year (Finance and Premises) had to be cancelled due to the snow, but yesterday the Assessment and Curriculum Committee met to discuss the progress of pupils. Governors have a training session next week in preparation for the next Ofsted Inspection which will be due in the Autumn. The Full Governing Body will meet on 22<sup>nd</sup> March. So far this term a number of Governors have

been into school to review safeguarding and safer recruitment procedures, and to help review the school website.

Attendance – The school's attendance is picking nicely, as the remnants of all the unpleasant viruses finally dissipates. Whole school attendance now stands at 96.49% and is improving every day. So far for this half term, there are 238 pupils on track for 100% attendance! That is really impressive. There 61

pupils on track for 100% attendance for the whole year, which would certainly beat last year's 27. It would be brilliant to have so many children celebrating 100% on the last day of term in the summer.

**Parentpay and School Lunches** – You will remember on the last Newsletter, that we spoke about the alarming debt that the school had on Parentpay for school lunches.

Whilst the debt is slowing going in the right direction now, it is still part of the daily routine for the Office Team to ring parents if their child has ordered lunch that is not covered on the Parentpay account balance.

This continues to waste valuable time for the staff involved in this.

Parentpay accounts are the responsibility of the parent/carer, and to that end can we again urge everyone to regularly check their account, ensuring that if your child is ordering a school lunch that funds are on the account to pay for the lunch taken. A school lunch will be refused, and a packed lunch will need to be supplied if the funds are not available.

**Netball** - On Tuesday a team of eight Year 5 and 6 pupils went to Newent School to take part in a high 5 netball competition.

The team played 4 matches, winning one and drawing three. They came second



in our group out of five schools and the children showed some excellent team work on the court.

Well done to all pupils who took part!

**Sports Relief** – This year St White's will participate in Sports Relief week (17<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> March).

On 23<sup>rd</sup> March, children will be invited to dress up in red.



**And finally** – I would like to ask for parents' cooperation regarding two matters, the first is hair styles. Our boys in particular, are coming to school with increasingly 'unusual'

haircuts, including shaved shoon the side of heads. It is a challenge for the school, as it is good to see children taking a pride in

their appearance but there seems to be an awful lot of children trying to push boundaries well beyond what is acceptable. Please would you ensure therefore that hair is one natural colour, a No 3 cut as the shortest, long hair is tied back and there are no extremes of colour or styles. This seems to be the general consensus in our local secondary schools and the school asks that this is adhered to here please.

The other request of support is in relation to



children's behaviour on the way to school but in particular, on the way home. A number of our children are knocking over toddlers when they are running around outside the classroom

before they go in but also when they run down the path at the back of the school on the way home. Some children are also hanging on the trees at the bottom of the path. Please would parents ensure that children are behaving sensibly both to and from school.

It has also been reported to school by members of staff and the public, that some of our older children, who are allowed to walk home on their own, are behaving extremely

disrespectfully as they do so; shouting and waving at drivers, running in front of cars and messing around with the salt and grit bins



along the roads. The greatest concern is the lack of understanding about the risk children are taking when they are playing 'chicken' in front of cars but also the fact that they do not understand that they represent St White's School, even when they are out in the community.

This sort of behaviour is completely unacceptable and again, the school would appreciate your support in this matter.
