As part of this enhancement the school needs to develop links will trades who may be able to source simple, free equipment for the school to use. Are you a tree surgeon? Do you know any builders, electricians, milkmen / women, kitchen fitters? Below is a list of items that the school is keen to acquire;

- Milk crates
- Wooden crates
- Cable reels (of all different sizes)
- Pallets
- Old kitchen units (to build a mud kitchen)
- Plastic guttering
- Plastic piping (of all different sizes)
- Wood to build a bird hide
- Green wood for children to saw / whittle / build with
- Old steering wheels
- Tarpaulin
- Wooden planks / decking lengths / planters
- Jerry cans with taps

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- Wicker baskets
- Ropes and pulleys
- Large kitchen pots / cauldrons / kitchen utensils
- Children's wheelbarrows
