to ensure that they are safe. This is particularly important for our older children who walk to school unaccompanied, as we must be able to raise an alert immediately if a child who is expected at school does not arrive.

If your child is absent and we have not heard from you, the school will make a concerted effort to contact make by telephone and text to ascertain the reason for absence. The office team or family support worker will use all the contact numbers that have been provided including home, mobile and work numbers.

If a child is absent from school without explanation, this absence is recorded as unauthorised. In some circumstances, the school may have to report unexplained absences to the Local Authority, if they are concerned for the safety of the child.

What the school askes is that, parents and carers contact the office team by 9.00 am,



either by telephone, email, or using the link on the school website. When you do so, please let the person that you speak to know the

reason for your child's absence – i.e. the nature of the illness, and when you expect your child to return. If you have told us your child will definitely be absent for a number of days, then you do not need to contact us on a daily basis, but if there is any uncertainty, or if the absence goes over a weekend, please do let us know.

Adult Education – Maths – The school is so pleased to be able to offer parents and carers

the opportunity to boost their knowledge and skills.



Gloucestershire Adult Education's free numeracy class is being delivered here at St White's Primary School. The course will be running every Wednesday morning between 9.00 am and 11.00 am, starting on the 20th September 2017. A crèche will also be available if you have young children.

For people working towards Entry Level, Functional Maths means that maths is taught in a way that is relevant to everyday life, focussing on your individual needs and



providing you with the essential skills required. And so it's a golden opportunity for you to improve your employment prospects but it's also a great way to learn about how to

help your children with their homework?

There is still time to book a place, so contact Caroline by popping into school, or telephone the office.



Attendance – The current whole school attendance stands at 97.3%. Although this is really good news so early in the term, as the school's aim is to be as close to 100% as possible this year, it is concerning that the vast majority of absences so far, are due to children being taken on holiday.

Getting your child to school on-time, every day, unless they are sick, is really essential. There are lots of reasons why it's important for your child to miss as *little* school time as possible. For example, children who miss school, often fall behind with their work and

do less well than their peers. When children return from extended periods of absence it can also be hard for them to resettle into school routines. It is one



of the most important building blocks for their future success.

The school's attendance is monitored very closely by different authorities, to ensure that we are placing the right degree of importance on our children attending school. The school understands that the Local Authority are introducing a new protocol for issuing penalty notices. Further information on this will be provided for parents and the school will reflect their expectations in our pupil attendance policy.

Celebration Assembly – Celebration Assemblies are a regular feature of the school

week. Children really look forward to them and I know you do too. This year, they will usually be held on Fridays.

Our first celebration takes place on Friday

22nd September at 2.45pm. To ensure that you have plenty of time, pupils will be



nominated for special awards the week before and parents will receive an invitation *via parentmail*, eight days in advance, giving you more notice to make arrangements to be able to attend.

Free School Meals –Are you entitled? - A reminder that although your child may already have meals under the *Universal Free*



School Meal system
(applicable to
Reception, Year 1 and
Year 2 pupils), you may
still be entitled to free
school meals. Your
child might be able to
get free school meals if

you get any of the following:

- Income Support income-based Jobseeker's Allowance income-related Employment and Support Allowance support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 the quaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

If you this applies to you, it is well worth applying online for Free School Meals through Gloucestershire County Council. The website is

E-Safety – The children's wellbeing is at the heat of everything we do here at St White's. This is why the school's safeguarding policies



and procedures are constantly being reviewed and updated. It is a top priority in school for

example, to talk about internet safety. Because it is so incredibly easy to access children can easily be exposed to very inappropriate content. There are lots of dangers that exist for children and they need supervision when using the internet whether they are 5 or 15 years old. Adults need to remain attentive both in school but also at home.

YouTube is very popular with children, who I know use it often to watch pop videos for example. However,

this week children having been talking about watching clips of films that are adult rated and this has led to some particularly unpleasant stories being circulated about clowns. This has caused some distress to other children in school and the school has had to reassure some children that it is just silly nonsense.

The school has however, had a report that a person has been seen driving in the local area



wearing a clown mask.
Having spoken with our
local PCSO, we understand
that they aware and are
keeping a look out. What
they have asked is that if
someone sights a person in

a car wearing a clown mask, to try to get the registration and a description of the car and then report it to the Police on 101.

School Security – The safety of your children



on the school site is extremely important. I want to remind you that if you visit the school during the day, you must only be let onto the site by a member of staff in the school office? They are responsible for monitoring who is requesting entry to the school site at all times.

It is the responsibility of every person to announce themselves to the office team, including visitors not connected to the school. Everyone must use the intercom systems and under no circumstances should anyone 'tailgate' in behind another person. Staff must know who is on the site at all times and everyone should come to the school office to formally sign in.

The school would therefore ask for your support so that in the event you are visiting school or leaving the premises, you do not let other people onto the site and encourage them to use the intercom system to announce themselves. Thank you for your continued support with this matter.

Safeguarding Policy Review and Staff

training – The school has been busy reviewing and updating the school's safeguarding and child protection policies and procedures. Staff have been undertaking additional safeguarding this year so that they are able to recognise the signs of abuse and are well informed about child protection procedures. The latest training that they have completed has been an online course to recognise the signs of Child Sexual Exploitation. yourself informed, just follow the links and you will be able to access an online programme that is easy to use and well worth taking the time to visit.
