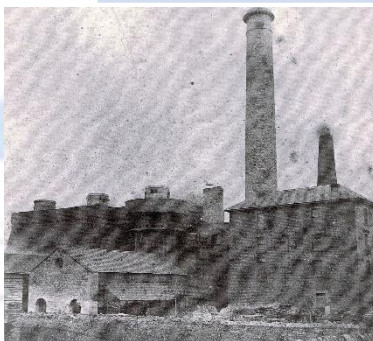
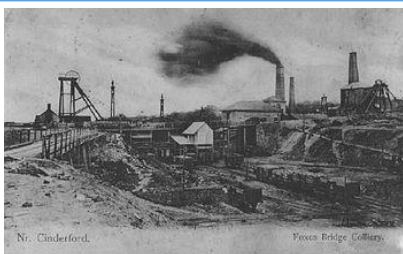
Topic: Industrial Revolution in the Forest of Dean

Forest of Dean

- Until the time of the Industrial Revolution, the Forest of Dean had a very small population. The Forest was mostly used to supply wood for the building of ships and for hunting.
- When vast deposits of coal and iron were found, many mines were established in the area (such as Clearwell, Hopewell).
- As more people were needed to work in the Forest of Dean, many villages and towns were created to support workers in the area (such as Cinderford).
- Large ironworks were built in the Forest to supply iron and steel to the rest of the country (such as Darkhill).
- Railways were built to move supplies around the Forest of Dean easier.

Ore	Rocks that contain minerals and metals.

Community	A group of households that live in an area.
Ironworks	A place where ore is processed into iron or steel.
Smelting	Heating ore to extract metals and minerals.
Colliery	A coal mine and the buildings to support it.
Rural	A place that is mostly reliant on farming.
Modern	Recent, using the most current technology.
Population	The total number of people in an area.
Empire	A number of countries around the world controlled by a different country.
Labour	The time and energy you put into work.
