**One world** 

There are approximately over nineteen million people living in Malawi and the landscape is very diverse.

84% of the population live in rural areas (the countryside) and 16% live in urban areas (towns and cities).

A lot of the people depend on farming for their livelihoods and the main exports from the country are tobacco, tea, sugar and dried legumes.

At least 50% of the population are living below the world poverty line. 80% of those living below this line live in rural areas and 20% in urban areas.
