closing date for entries to be returned to school is Friday 14<sup>th</sup> February. All artwork must be A4 size. Your name and school must




be written on the reverse of your piece. A short description of your piece of work should be included with your submission. Only 8

**Science Ambassadors** We had lots of applications for the role of science ambassador and a group of 9 children were chosen for having the best applications and are wearing their badges with pride.




