For Christians what kind of King is Jesus?

What should I already know?

- Christians believe God is a divine being. He is worshiped all over the world.
- God is a being that can be viewed differently to every individual.
- Understand that Christians worship through prayers and hymns.
- Singing is believed to be a way to communicate with God.
- Psalm 103 is a Christian prayer that celebrates the Lord.
- Christians have stories which show how they believe God helped people.
- God is displayed as almighty, glory, righteous and gracious.
- Medieval Christians built cathedrals to show glory in God.
- Churches are often built in the shape of a cross with the altar facing east towards the rising sun.

Key knowledge

- People have changed the world in which we live in and these include: Marcus Rashford,, Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King and Prof Sarah Gilbert as examples. These people are recognised with Nobel Peace Awards if chosen as winners.
- Jesus displayed kingship to everyone he met.
- Jesus was offered to be king by the Devil but he turned this offer down.
- Jesus believed there was more to being a king than just ruling kingdoms.
- Kingship includes – humility, patience, empathy, leadership, honesty and dedication as some examples.
- Christians believed that Jesus came to Earth to get people to heaven and to make the world more like heaven.
- Jesus told parables (stories) about the 'kingdom of heaven' to explain his ideas.
- Parables included – The Feast (the great banquet), The temptation in the wilderness and The tenants in the vineyard.
- Christians believe that the kingdom of God is where God rules and not territory but human hearts, minds and lives.
- Jesus had 10 commandments in which he believed people should live by.
- Jesus tried to make the world a better place by sharing his parables and sharing his message.
- Local churches now follow this message and try to impact the community around them. For example Cinderford churches support Fairtrade.
- Peace can be improved by completing small tasks and was in Jesus vision.
