Article 1 - Everyone under 18 has these rights.
Article 2- All children have these rights, no matter who they are.
No child should be treated unfairly on any basis.
Article 4 - The government has a responsibility to make sure your rights are protected.
Article 5 - Your family has the responsibility to help you learn to exercise your rights, and to ensure that your rights are protected.
Article 7 - You have the right to a name.
Article 12 - You have the right to give your opinion.
Article 13 - You have the right to find out things.
Article 14 - You have the right to choose your own religion
Article 15 - You have the right to choose your own friends
Article 16 - You have the right to privacy.
Article 17 - You have the right to get information that is important to your well-being.
Article 22 - You have the right to help if you are a refugee
Article 24 - You have the right to the best health care possible
Article 28 - You have the right to a good quality education.
Article 31 - You have the right to play and rest.
Article 42 - You have the right to know your rights!
