Animals share characteristics with other animals in their group.


Animals can be grouped into carnivore, omnivore or herbivore.

omnivore

amphibians Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin. birds All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings. Fish live and breathe under water. fish They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills. Mammals are animals that breathe mammals air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby. reptiles All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin. carnivore Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are carnivores. herbivore Animals that only eat plants are herbivores.

Animals that eat both plants and

other animals are omnivores.
