Gareth Hughes who was our Local Authority Governor has also resigned and we will be seeking a replacement as soon as possible. The Governors and school staff would like to thank them both for all their help and hard work. ## **Parent Questionnaire**

Thank you to everyone who filled in the



parent questionnaire at parent evenings this term. I thought that you might like to know what is being said about your school.

I am very happy to state that 97% of parents/carers stated that their children were happy at the school and 99% stated that their child feels safe at this school.

One parent wrote that their child was very enthusiastic about the topic this term and has been telling family members all about it. This is great to hear and we are grateful for the feedback that this is going well.

One person had a concern about bullying. I would remind you that the school has two anti-bullying champions, Clare Tilling, Headteacher, and Erica Fearn, Family Support Worker. If you have any concerns about your child being unhappy at school, please do get in touch with one of us and we will always ensure that it is dealt with as swiftly as possible. Children are always welcome to go and share any concerns with Erica, their teacher, or indeed any other member of staff that they feel comfortable talking to.

Two parents were worried about the crossing at St White's Road. The school shares your concerns and is seeking to have a crossing put



in there. Governors are pursuing this and I am sure that letters that you write to the council will make our argument even more persuasive.

Applications must be submitted by 15th January 2020.
