re will sh & r, or Changes to School Meal ordering after Easter VERY IMPORTANT – All parents should have received a letter with information about the new system for ordering school meals after the Easter holidays. All parents must order school meals online by the Sunday for the following week. Even if you don't currently pay for a hot meal for your child, you will still need to enter the menu choice on Parentpay for the week ahead.

Please be aware that once your selection has been made for the week ahead, you will have 2 hours to ensure that adequate funds are available to pay for the selections made. Failure to do this will result in the system rejecting the choices made, and no lunch would be ordered through the canteen as a result for a child.

A demonstration is being held on Monday, 26 March 2018 at 3.20 pm. You will need your Parentpay login to choose the menu options. If you do not have this or it has been mislaid, please contact the school office, who can generate a copy for you.

The price of school dinner is also increasing from 16 April 2018 to £2.36 per meal.
