Technical vocabulary

Tone	The lightness or darkness of an object
Observational drawing	Drawing what you can see
Shadow	A dark area where light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object
Line	A mark made on a surface that joins different points
Shape	A flat area surrounded by edges or an outline
Outline	Line that shows the outside of a shape

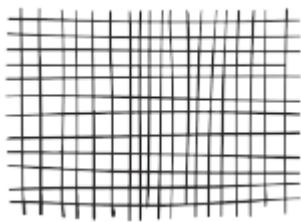
Observation window

- I can use an observation window to focus on looking closely at part of an image.



Hatching

Hatching – closely spaced parallel lines
Cross-hatching – lines placed at an angle to one another



Pencils

The letters on a pencil will tell you its level of hardness or softness. H: Hard; F: Fine Point; HB: Hard Black; B: Black. Hard pencils produce light lines while soft pencils produce dark lines. Different pencils can be used for different purposes.
