The school has also recruited our Minibus Driver now, Mr Dennis Griffiths, who we are equally pleased to have on board.

Mr Griffiths has had many years' experience in the army, and in particular dealing with all aspects of transport, so we know that our pupils will all be in very safe hands.

Harvest Festival - The harvest festival was a great success on Friday 20th October. During

the morning lower key stage two classes worked with caterlink to make bread,



soup and a fruit platter.

It was lovely to see so many parents, grandparents during the afternoon. The children thoroughly enjoyed showing them what they were learning about in class.

We would like to say a huge thank you to the food bank for taking part in the harvest assembly and telling the children about the importance of the food bank and how donations help others.

A big thank you must also go out to everyone who donated to the harvest. The total



weight of donations was 224.7kg. The coop has kindly agreed to match this, so nearly 500kg of food will be distributed by the food bank to people in need.

Co-op Fairtrade visits - This week LKS2 classes had the opportunity to visit the coop and learn about Fairtrade. The children were

taken on a tour around the shop and warehouse and learnt about the process food



and goods take to reach our shopping baskets. The children had a talk about Fairtrade and then they went around the shop floor completely a quiz about Fairtrade. Finally the coop generously gave each child a bag with Fairtrade products in. The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit and now have a good understanding of what Fairtrade is and how it helps.

Bullying – If you have any concerns about bullying in school, the school has two Anti-Bullying Champions. Clare Tilling is the Anti-



The school takes any concerns very seriously and would encourage you to go to either the class teacher or either of these members of staff if you have any concerns at all. They will carry out an investigation, seek resolution for the child who is feeling unhappy and keep you fully informed about the process.

If you have any questions, please do come in and we will be happy to explain the process in more detail.

Attendance – Whole school attendance now stands at 96.96%. It is really disappointing to have dropped below 97% and we know there

have been a few nasty bugs around which have led to some sickness absence. The attendance committee met last week to review the attendance figures for the first term, and we would like to share some information with you.

This time last year, sickness accounted for 71% of the absence, with unauthorised holiday just 2%. This year, unauthorised holiday is 34% of the total absence, with illness at 52%.

Illness accounts for a very similar number of days lost in both years, although this year it is a smaller percentage of the overall absence because of holidays. Children who miss two weeks of school can only achieve a maximum of 94.5% attendance if they attend every day for the rest of the school year. Children miss so much when they are absent from school, not just their learning but also the social side of school and all the enrichment opportunities such as trips, clubs and all the special visitors who come into school to speak to the children.

All parents will have received an email, or a printed copy of a letter which refers to the school's new attendance policy which has been revised in line with the new County Council protocol on penalty notices and prosecution for term-time holidays.
