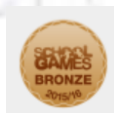




St White's Primary School Sports Premium Plan: 2021 – 2022

The subject Action Plan emphasises the following developments for the next school year 2021 – 22:

- Ensure all pupils are participating in high quality PE sessions for 2 hours a week.
- Continuing focused development of staff confidence and utilising the use of assessment in PE so that staff have a better understanding of the requirements of physical education.
- Ensure that all pupils in KS2 take part in house matches over the course of the year.
- Develop the use of knowledge organisers so that pupils understand the knowledge required to play a sport.
- Continue to embed sportsmanship into every part of the curriculum.
- Identify both the less physically active and the more able children and make sure their varying needs are catered for.
- Develop staff confidence and knowledge through sport specific CPD from recognised high level coaches.
- Provide staff with the appropriate equipment and kit to help show PE is a high priority of the school and is valued by all staff.
- Retain the Gold School Games Award.
- Provide more opportunity for pupils to attend live sporting events to help raise the profile of sport and children's aspirations.
- Provide in school experiences of different sports and provide pathways to the community through grass roots sports.
