Wraparound Care







The school offers a wraparound care service both before and after school. This is ideal for working parents who need regular childcare and can also be helpful for any parents who have occasional childcare needs. We welcome children from 7:30 am for the morning session - the cost is £3.50 and includes breakfast. In the afternoons wraparound care is available until 5:30pm - the cost is £7.00 and includes a sandwich snack. Our wraparound leaders are really popular with children and organise lots of fun activities including indoor and outdoor games.

We prefer bookings in advance for a whole term, but we are happy to accommodate parents with irregular shift patterns and one-off bookings with a couple of days notice.

School Governors



The school has a governing body of 14 Governors made up of parents, staff and others with an interest in the school. The responsibility of the Governors is to ensure the school provides the best possible education for the children, by both supporting and challenging the leadership team.

Our chair is Matt Bishop and the Vice-Chair is Dan Beard.

There are four committees which report to the full Governing Body - Finance and Premises which reviews the budget, keeps an eye on spending and deals with any issues relating to the building and grounds chaired by Richard Jones, Personnel chaired by Matt Bishop, Assessment which consists of Governors with responsibility for Assessment, Special Educational Needs and Pupil Premium look in detail at the school's data for achievement and progress, finally Curriculum which looks at subject areas, teaching and learning and policies such a marking and homework. The last two are both chaired by Dan Beard. Each of the Governors has a specific area of responsibility such as safeguarding, health and safety or a specific key stage.

They all make a huge commitment in attending around 12 meetings a year as well as individual visits to the school for learning walks, meetings with staff to review their specific interest and attending school events.
