
### St White's Open Day - The school will be

Richard Pitman, the author of the


Jimmy Threepwood children's books will also be in attendance. There will be refreshments for everyone and we encourage our little ones to come along in their

**Attendance** - The year has started off very well with whole school attendance at just over 98% for the first two weeks. Sadly this is likely to drop over the next few weeks as we have already had a high proportion of holiday requests this term.

What is very pleasing is that the number of



pupils who achieved 100% attendance for the year went up from 25 in 2017 to 44

in 2018. This is a tremendous achievement. Congratulations to all this children. Their pictures will be taken next week and displayed in the gallery opposite the sports hall for the year.

The school is still working toward that elusive 100% whole school attendance day. It would be wonderful to achieve this target this term.



I would like to remind parents that the school expects pupils to attend school every day unless there is an authorised reason for absence such as illness. The school does not authorise holidays.

Parents who take their children out of school without authorisation even for just a couple of days may receive a penalty notice from the local authority. The school's pupil attendance policy is on the school's website or a copy of the policy is available from the office. If you have any queries about attendance, do not hesitate to contact the school.

Aberdovey Information Evening – With

time marching on it won't be long before this year's Residential Trip will be leaving for Aberdovey. The school will be holding a final information drop in information session for parents/carers and pupils taking part on Thursday, 11th October 2018, between 3.20 and 4.00pm. Staff will be on hand to share details of the trip, including accommodation information, coach travel and meal times. This is a great opportunity for you to ask any questions you might have about the trip and so I do hope that all concerned will be able to attend.

Parking – As you will all be aware. The school



has a Travel Charter. It provides clear and concise guidelines to parents/carers and staff in the form of the St White's Primary School Access and Parking Policy. An explanatory letter containing the policy was sent to parents/guardians of new pupils and is available for all parents/carers and staff through a range of media including the school prospectus, school website and regular bulletins such as school newsletters and parent mail.

Since our return to school, I have received a number of complaints regarding parking and also unsafe driving. I understand that parents

are parking on the Zig Zag lines on Buckshaft Road. Whilst the Highway Code explains



that yellow Zig Zag lines without signs to accompany them do not have a Traffic Regulation Order giving the local council powers to issue PCN fines, they are placed on the road by schools to advise motorists not to wait or park on the lines **for the safety of children.** Although the local council do not have the powers to enforce penalties, police frequently issue tickets in such cases. Tickets are issued on the grounds of causing an obstruction to either other motorists or pedestrians and not for parking on the yellow zig zag lines directly. I would urge parents not to park on the zig zags because it is blocking the road and putting our children in danger.

Please drive with due care and attention, which ever entrance that you use. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter. **School website** – A reminder to parents and carers that there is lots of information on the school website to view, including photos and information for all classes. To view you will need to accept Cookies! Thank you.
