What? Realism was an art movement that revolted against the emotional and exaggerated themes of Romanticism. Artists and writers began to explore the reality of every day life. When? The Realism movement lasted around forty years from 1840 to 1880. Characteristics Realism artists tried to depict the real world exactly as it appears. They painted everyday subjects and people.
