Travelling to and from School – Now that the weather is so much better, it is lovely to see so many families enjoying the walk or cycle to school. A message was sent out on



Parentmail about the Big Pedal Challenge which has been running over the last two weeks and we do hope

that parents and children will continue to walk, cycle and scoot to school. We have been asked by the County Council to remind parents that the Travel Charter suggests that parents do not park at the Sneyd Wood Road entrance to drop off and collect children. The local parish council have also asked us to remind parents to be considerate of the local residents when parking their cars.

Dangerous driving – there have been an increasing number of reports of parents driving dangerously near the school and a few near miss incidents reported. The Sneyd Wood Road estate was designed as a "shared space" for all road users including pedestrians, cyclists and cars. This means there are no pavements and no road markings. The road twists and turns in a way which means there is often little visibility of oncoming traffic, so cars need to proceed very slowly and approach

bends and corners in the expectation of a vehicle approaching from another direction.

Buckshaft Road and St White's Road have very narrow pavements which make it difficult for parents walking



with groups of children and pushchairs to pass and cross and there is often lots of parked traffic. Although the legal speed limit may be 30mph on these local roads, in reality this is <u>far too fast</u> when there are lots of other road users in the area. To ensure everyone's safety, please drive really carefully near our school.

Nits! - There are still some cases of nits in

school. Please can all parents use the Easter holiday period to comb through hair regularly to check for and make sure all the children are clear of



nits. We can only get rid of the problem if everyone checks and treats regularly.

School Crossing Patrol – There have been no applicants for the school crossing patrol vacancy. The job is being re-advertised, so if there are any parents who are interested please contact the school office. For now, parents will have to continue to be vigilant.

Happy Easter – We hope all our children and families have an enjoyable Easter break, and we look forward to seeing everyone on Tuesday 23rd April.
