the school has a value that is woven into all areas of school life. This term our value is commitment, which




forms part of the school's vision statement. Our children will be learning that motivation is what gets them started when they are aiming for a goal and then commitment is what will keep them striving toward that goal.

expressed their concerns about the health of



**Attendance** – I am delighted to announce that at the end of last term, 151 certificates

for 100% attendance were awarded in the second half term, and there are a total of 107



pupils with 100% attendance since the start of the school year. This is just wonderful! Our whole school attendance for the year so far is 97.01%. Of the absence, 70% is authorised absence for sickness, etc and 30% is unauthorised absence for holidays or lateness after 9am.

The classes that have won the attendance awards for the most weeks with best attendance are for KS1 - Nightingale Class with 6 weeks and for KS2 - Swift & Jay Classes with 4 weeks. These classes will have a special activity in school to celebrate over the next few weeks. Well done and thank you to all our children and families for valuing regular attendance at school.
