Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Circle time: talking about their actions and behaviours.

Learning to adapt their behaviour to different events for example a change of routine.
Develop their confidence and self-esteem while developing their independence.

Understanding the World

Talks about significant events in their own lives, in the past and present
Talks about people who are important to them
Knows that we are all different and that this makes them unique
Talks about and looks closely at change in relation to how they have changed as they have grown
To comment on and ask questions about their familiar world, talking about why things happen and how things work.
Forest school will help children to understand and talk about the world we live in.

Expressive Arts and Design
