Theologians are curious about world religion and are respectful towards the beliefs of others whilst celebrating diversity.

Who was to blame for the death of Jesus?

1. Judas Iscariot – Betrayed Jesus acted later killed himself with guilt.
2. The Pharisees – Angered by Jesus for not respecting their authority.
3. Jesus himself – He told the Roman Governor that he was the king of Jews (treason against the roman empire).
4. Pontius Pilate – Did not want Jesus to be killed but could have done more to stop it.
5. The people of Jerusalem – The crowd decided that Jesus should be crucified over a murderer.
6. Satan – Tempted Judas into his act of betrayal and encouraged the crowd to sentence Jesus to death.

Technical vocabulary

incarnation	The Christian belief that God became a man in the person of Jesus.
salvation	Human souls can be saved from eternal punishment.
succinct	Written briefly and clearly.
crucifixion	A way in which to kill someone who has committed a crime.
resurrection	The rising of Christ from the dead.
anointed	Putting oil on a person
Passover	A celebration of the story of Exodus in Judaism.
covenant	A written agreement or promise between two or more parties.
Gethsemane	Is a garden at the foot of Mount of Olives.

Holy Communion

- Means togetherness -re-enactment of 'The Last Supper'.
- Bread used to symbolise body being broken. Wine used to symbolise blood being spilled.
- Confirmation classes can be taken before Holy Communion.
- Girls wear white to show purity.
- Boys wear a special tie.
- Bread and wine blessed by the priest.
- Catholic Christians believe that when the bread and wine is eaten, Jesus will enter their bodies / eternal life.

Martyr

- Martyr is somebody that has given their life for a religious or other beliefs.
- Some Christians follow Jesus' example even to the point of dying – they are known as martyrs.
- Some of these martyrs are commemorated at Westminster Abbey.
- Salvation from sin was the purpose of Jesus' life, death and resurrection



The events of Holy week

Holy week - the week before Easter, starting on Palm Sunday.

1. Jesus arrived in Jerusalem.
2. Jesus visited the Temple.
3. Jesus spoke to his followers on the Mount of Olives.
4. Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver.
5. Jesus celebrated Passover with his disciples (The Last Supper).
6. Jesus washed his disciples feet.
7. Jesus went to the garden of gethsemane to pray.
8. Jesus was arrested.
9. Jesus was taken to Pontius Pilate.
10. Jesus carried the cross through Jerusalem.
11. Jesus was nailed to the cross and died.
12. Jesus was buried in a tomb.
13. On the third day an angel told Jesus' followers he had risen from the dead.
