What should I already know?

- Can talk about some religious stories from KS1 (Easter, Christmas etc).
- Can recognise some religious words, e.g. about God.
- Identify some of their own feelings in the stories they hear.
- Recognise that loving others is important in lots of communities.
- Give examples of ways in which people express their identity and belonging within faith communities.

The Creation Day by Day

The creation story takes place in Genesis 1:1-2:3.

- Day 1 God created light and separated the light from the darkness, calling light "day" and darkness "night."
- Day 2 God created an expanse to separate the waters and called it "sky."
- Day 3 God created the dry ground and gathered the waters, calling the dry ground "land," and the gathered waters "seas." On day three, God also created vegetation (plants and trees).
- Day 4 God created the sun, moon, and the stars to give light to the earth and to govern and separate the day and the night. These would also serve as signs to mark seasons, days, and years.
- Day 5 God created every living creature of the seas and every winged bird, blessing them to multiply and fill the waters and the sky with life.
- Day 6 God created the animals to fill the earth. On day six, God also created
 man and woman (Adam and Eve) in his own image to commune with him. He
 blessed them and gave them every creature and the whole earth to rule over,
 care for, and cultivate.
- Day 7 God had finished his work of creation and so he rested on the seventh day, blessing it and making it holy.

What Is Forgiveness?

Forgiveness (noun) is the action of forgiving or being forgiven. To forgive (verb) is to stop feeling angry or resentful towards someone for an offence, flaw or mistake. Forgiving means to change the way you feel about something that has happened or been done to you. Jews and Christians believe that the Ten Commandments were rules given by God and that to break these rules is a sin.
