#### **Sports Events and Competitions**

We have been busier than ever with lots of children going out to represent the school – a really big thank you to Mr Jones and all the staff who go out on these trips, especially to Mr Greening who drives the minibus and has been out and about nearly every day for the last couple of weeks! Here are some highlights!

On Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> June we competed at the **Commonwealth Games** event at Wyedean (long jump, relay races, cricket and tri golf). After a close competition we finished second by 1 point. Well done for excellent sportsmanship!



On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June we sent two teams to compete in the **Gloucestershire Cricket Tournament** at Cinderford cricket club – after some very close games and a final one of our teams won the tournament and today they are now representing us at the County Finals in Bristol! On 14<sup>th</sup> June six of our pupils had the privilege to meet Andy Lewis MBE who is a retired British Paratriathlete and has won gold medals at European, world and Paralympic levels.
