**FIRE ALARM!!!** – Thank you to all the parents and children who waited so patiently outside in the cold on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> January when the fire alarm went off first thing in the morning.

The alarm was due to a faulty sensor, not an

actual fire, but the school was evacuated very quickly with all staff and pupils accounted for.



The gates had been opened for a short

time, and so there were some families on the school site who were guided to the assembly area. The gates were then closed to ensure there were no additional people on site.

The governors reviewed how the fire procedures had worked on that morning and were pleased that all stakeholders were kept safe. We have given thought to what would happen if the alarm goes off at the end of the day when the gates are open and there are lots of parents on site. We would not plan to hold a fire alarm practice at this time of day.

If you hear the fire alarm while you are on site waiting to collect your child/ren from school, please walk straight to the MUGA.



# Parents should not attempt to enter the building and should not try to take their children.

Remaining children and their teachers will also walk to the assembly area in the MUGA.

We would ask parents to leave their children in the care of the teacher at this time. Once the whole school is assembled on the MUGA and the building swept to ensure everyone is accounted for, only then will children be released to their families. In the unlikely event that this happens, we hope parents will understand the most important thing is to make sure that everyone is safe.
