**Re: Forest Schools** 

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am delighted to be able to tell you that the school is able to, once again, run allotment and forest school sessions this academic year. The allotment has thrived over recent months and we are very grateful to Nicky Herbert for all her hard work. In the Forest School area, the trees and foliage surrounding the base camp are continuing to mature and provide an ideal location for us to explore, have fun and learn.

Over recent years, the allotment has become an integral part of the school. Caring for a school garden/allotment has shown to improve a child' social skills and behaviour. The process of planning and tending a crop will help children develop skills, such as respect and patience. Gardening also encourages teamwork skills as they take part in group work activities and are encouraged to take responsibility, by caring for their own crops.

Forest School is an inspirational concept, providing learning opportunities through practical activities in an outdoor environment. Children enjoy the freedom to explore and experience the natural world in all seasons and in all weathers (except thunder and lightning or very high winds). It embraces an approach of nurturing, supporting and developing the self-esteem of participants and hosts the ideal environment in which to further develop our children's problem solving, risk taking, creativity and teamwork skills. The school is very fortunate to have two members of staff who are fully qualified to run outdoor learning sessions – Miss Sykes and Mrs Cook.

This year, allotment sessions will continue to be run by Nicky Herbert and Forest School sessions will be primarily led by Mrs Cook with Miss Sykes on occasions. We will continue to send weekly reminders to classes about their allotment sessions.

Set out below is the timetable to show when Forest Schools and allotment are due to take place over the year. Before each term, a consent form will be sent out to parents for Forest Schools. These must be completed and returned before the start of each group of sessions.

The safety and welfare of the pupils participating in Forest School and allotment sessions is paramount and therefore all tasks are age-appropriate and risk assessments have been carried out for all activities. The clothing that the children wear is also extremely important. Forest Schools will take place in all weathers, other than high winds and/or thunder and lightning. A safety sweep is done before every session so that we can ensure that the site is safe even if it is wet. To ensure that all children are able to access the sessions fully, please ensure that your child(ren) have the required clothes in school for every session (see below). The school will provide waterproof coats and trousers for all children to wear when it is necessary. If the correct clothes are not in school your child(ren) will spend the afternoon in the school building completing work left by their class teacher.

If you have any issues with getting the clothing your child requires, please do not hesitate to come into school to see me about it.



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#### **Essential Equipment: Clothing**

Please ensure that your child has the following items of clothing for the particular times of the year for their Forest School sessions. As previously mentioned, children will not be able to take part in the sessions if they do not have the appropriate clothing to protect them from the weather and from cuts, scrapes and stings. Adults and children must wear long sleeves tops and trousers at all times. Layering clothing is the best way to keep warm and adjust to suit their temperature. We do provide children with waterproof clothing to put over their clothes but please do be aware that your child may still come home with mud on their clothes.
