



### What should I already know?

### Knowledge

It's important that privacy settings are set on your computers in order to keep personal information safe.

We must respect the privacy of others when sharing information. We must not share any information that does not belong to us without the owners permission. By understanding this we will be **responsible digital citizens**.  
Manipulation is where somebody puts you under pressure to do something or behave in a certain way. It is not acceptable to be manipulated or to manipulate someone else. If you feel like you might be being manipulated you should tell a trusted adult.
