
What do Christians believe Jesus did to 'save' people?

Key Knowledge

- Jesus anointed at Bethany religious ceremony where Jesus' death was planned.
- The Last Supper Jesus sat with his disciples and broke bread for a symbol of his body. Then blessed wine as a symbol of his blood and told the disciples he was to be murdered.
- Gethsemane a garden at the foot of the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem where Jesus prayed to remove his sorrow.
- Jesus arrested After praying in Gethsemane, Jesus' disciples fell asleep and the soldiers came to arrest him after he was betrayed by Judas.
- Jesus before the Sanhedrin Jesus face the chief priests and agreed to crucify Jesus.
- The Crucifixion Jesus was crucified Friday at noon. He was alive for three hours on the cross where there was an eclipse, an earthquake and a thick curtain inside the Temple was ripped in two.
- The burial of Jesus The day before Sabbath when the body was give to Joseph and placed his body in a tomb made out of rock.
- Who was to blame for Jesus death? Judas? The Pharisees? Jesus? Pontius Pilate? The people of Jerusalem? Satan?
- Jesus death was a sacrifice the price he paid to save people from their sins and bring them back to God.
- Holy Communion bread represents Jesus body and wine represents Jesus blood.
- Martyr is somebody that has given their life for a religious or other beliefs.
